## 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

- i. Counselling for admission in AIQ seats of ASU&H-UG & PG courses under Government, Government Aided ASU&H colleges, National Institutes, Central Universities, and Deemed Universities shall be conducted by AACCC, Ministry of AYUSH.
- ii. Counselling for admission in AIQ seats of ASU&H-UG & PG courses of Private Institutions other than Deemed Universities shall be conducted by the respective Counselling authorities of State/UT Government. The guidelines/Schedule for conduction of Counselling for admission in AIQ-UG & PG seats of Private ASU & H institutes other than Deemed Universities for the academic year 2026-27
- iii. Centralized admissions to all Government and Private Ayurved/Unani/Homoeopathy/ Yoga and Naturopathy colleges (Including Constituent Colleges of Private Universities) as per rules in Rajasthan for the session 2026-27 shall be made for 85% state Quota seats including 15% NRI seats (in Private institutes) and 15% seats of All India Quota in Private Institutions in BAMS/BUMS/BHMS.
- iv. The following courses shall be covered under the admission counselling conducted by the Admission Counselling Board constituted by the State Government:

**Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine & Surgery (BAMS)- (Total 5½ Years)**

The duration of BAMS course is 4½ years followed by compulsory internship of 1 Yr.

**Bachelor of Unani Medicine & Surgery (BUMS)- (Total 5½ Years)**

The duration of BUMS course is 4½ years followed by compulsory internship of 1 Yr.

**Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine & Surgery (BHMS) - (Total 5½ Years)**

The duration of BHMS course is 4½ years followed by compulsory internship of 1 Yr.

**Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yogic Science (BNYS) (Total 5½ Years) \***

The duration of BNYS course is 4½ years followed by compulsory internship of 1 Yr.

\*(All 100% Seats of BNYS will be filled by State AYUSH UG/PG Counselling Board, Govt. of Rajasthan)

## 2. Please read the following instructions carefully before filling out the online registration form.

(Available on the website)

- 3) College information regarding seats and fee etc.
- 4) All candidates are advised to visit the official websites of all participating institutions, including private universities, before filling out the option form and carefully verify the fee structure, hostel and mess charges, seat matrix, and all other applicable charges and admission-related information. The responsibility for the correctness and classification of seats shown in the seat matrix shall rest solely with the concerned institution. The Counselling Board shall not be responsible for any discrepancy or issue relating to the seat matrix, fee structure, hostel and mess charges, or any other fees or charges prescribed by any Government or Private College/University.

As per Section 14 of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, there shall be a uniform NEET (UG) for admission to undergraduate courses in each of the disciplines i.e. BAMS, BUMS, and BSMS courses of the Indian System of Medicine in all Medical Institutions governed under this Act. As per Section 14 of the National Commission for Homoeopathy Act, 2020, there shall be a uniform NEET (UG) for admission to undergraduate course, i.e. BHMS course of National Commission for Homoeopathy governed under this Act.

The NEET score along with some relevant data have been received from the NEET-2026 Conducting agency i.e., National Testing Agency (NTA) for NEET- 2026 by UG PG AYUSH Counselling Board, Rajasthan.

During the counselling process, the eligibility of candidates and their relevant documents shall be verified by the Counselling Board. Eligible candidates shall be allotted BAMS/BUMS/BHMS/BNYS colleges strictly on the basis of their merit, availability of seats, and the reservation policy of the State Government and the Government of India, as applicable. However, the allotted college/institution shall carry out the final verification of all original documents and eligibility of the candidates admitted through the Counselling Board, Rajasthan, at the time of reporting/admission, and the admission shall remain subject to such verification.

Colleges offering the BNYS course in the State shall be permitted to participate in the admission counselling process only if their communication or representation is received by the Counselling Board through the Office of the Registrar, DSRAU, and the Registrar of the respective University to which the college is affiliated.

## 3. REGISTRATION FEE

1. All candidates are required to deposit non-refundable registration fee of Rs. 2000/- for GEN/ EWS /OBC/MBC & Rs. 1500/- for SC, ST, ST-STA category candidate belonging to Rajasthan state domicile, through Internet banking / Debit card / Credit card.
2. All Candidates belonging to other states are required to deposit non-refundable application fee of Rs. 2000/-through Internet banking /Debit card/Credit card.

The registration fee is neither refundable, nor transferable and nor adjustable for any future State UG admissions.

Any plea in this matter shall not be entertained.

- Candidates who fail to register within the prescribed registration period shall not be considered for the counselling process.

#### 4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

##### 1. EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION

No candidate shall be allowed to be admitted to the BAMS/BUMS/BHMS/BNYS course until he or she has passed the qualifying examination as here under:

In case of BUMS: In eligibility criterion, either candidate must have passed Urdu or Arabic or Persian language as one of the subjects in the 10th Standard or in the 12th standard or the candidates shall have to study the Urdu language along with Arabic and Mantiq wa Falsafa (Logic and Philosophy) as a subject during the First Professional B.U.M.S session.

Counselling will be done on the basis of merit in NEET-2026 as per following cut off percentile/Marks Basis. (As per the press release dated 16 July 2026 by National Testing Agency:)

## **4.1 OTHER ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA LAID DOWN BY THE NCISM/NCH**

(Ref: - Secretary NCISM 1/2/2026-AACCC/Date 31.08.2026 Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India)

### **A. DIRECTIVES FOR COUNSELLING AUTHORITIES (CENTRAL/STATE/UT)**

#### **I. Common directives for State/UT Counselling and Admissions:**

##### **Eligibility Criteria to Participate in the Counselling:**

1. Colleges/Institutes who have received permission from the Medical Assessment and Rating Board/National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) for Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani streams and Medical Assessment and Rating Board/National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH) for admission to ASU&H (BHMS)- UG courses for the academic session 2026-27 shall only be eligible to participate in the counselling process.

##### **Seat Matrix (AIQ & State/UT Quota):**

2. The seat matrix for admission in the Government, Government-aided institutions and Private Institutions shall be fifteen per cent (15%) for All-India Quota and eighty-five per cent (85%) for State/Union Territory Quota as specified in the NCISM and NCH Regulations in force at the time of admission.

##### **Provided that-**

- i. the AIQ for the purpose of admission in all the Deemed Universities (both Government and Private-established under Central Act), shall be hundred per cent;
  - ii. The University and institute, which are already having more than fifteen per cent All- India Quota seats, shall continue to maintain that Quota:
  - iii. five per cent of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government and Government-aided institutions shall be filled up by candidate with specified disability in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) and based on the merit list of NEET (UG)-2026.
3. For state/UT Quota 85% of the seat matrix for Government Quota, Management Quota, NRI Quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy; however, all admissions in all Quotas (except foreign nationals) shall be through counselling conducted by State/UT counselling authority.
  4. All sanctioned/permitted seats by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (MARBISM) NCISM/Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy (MARBH)/NCH/, irrespective of categories/reservations, are to be filled only through online Counselling, i.e., Central/State/UT Counselling as the case may be (except foreign nationals).
  5. Ayush Admissions Central Counselling Committee (AACCC), Ministry of Ayush will conduct "AIQ-UG Online Counselling" for admission to AIQ (15%) seats under Govt./Govt. Aided Colleges/Institutes, Central/Deemed Universities (Established under Central Act) and National Institutes of ASU&H (BHMS) streams.
  6. The State/UT Counselling authorities shall conduct Counselling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H (BHMS) colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act). Further, State/UT Counselling shall be conducted in adherence to guidelines/schedule provided by NCISM/NCH to avoid the overlapping of the Schedule of AACCC Counselling and State/UT Counselling.
  7. For the State/UT Quota 85% the seat matrix for Government Quota, Management Quota, NRI Quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy; however, all admissions in all Quotas (except foreign nationals) shall be through online Counselling conducted by State/UT Counselling authority.
  8. Seat allotment in any category shall be as per inter-se-merit.
  9. No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks in NEET (UG)-2026 shall be eligible for admission to Undergraduate courses for the academic year 2026-27.
  10. Qualification Criterion: (As per the ASU&H-UG Regulations in force at the time of admission) (a) National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022 (b) National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Unani Education) Regulations-2022 (c) National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Siddha Education) Regulations-2022 (d) National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course- Bachelor Homeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S) Regulations-2022 (e) The National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course - Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S.) Amendment Regulations 2026 (f) NCISM's letter no. BOA/2-B/UG/2026 dated 19.08.2026 (g) NCISM's letter no.11-76/2021-BUSS(Unani-U.G.Reg) (h) NCISM's letter no.18-12/2021-BUSS(SID-UG-MSE) For admission to ASU & H-UG Courses:



**For admission to ASU&H-UG Courses:**

11. The eligibility to admission in ASU&H-UG courses should be as per the ASU&H-UG regulations and should be followed strictly. The details of qualifications for different categories are as follows:
  - For ASU&H- UG Courses the candidate shall have passed 10 +2 (or equivalent) with subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Biotechnology.
12. No candidate shall be admitted to BAMS, BSMS, BUMS & BHMS Degree Courses unless he/she has attained the age of seventeen years on or before the 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of his/her admission in the first year of the course. Further, there is no upper age limit for admission to ASU&H-UG courses.
13. No Authority or Institution shall admit any candidate to the Undergraduate courses in contravention of the criteria or procedure in respect of admissions, and any admissions made in contravention shall be cancelled by the NCISM/NCH.
14. Any admissions made beyond/over and above the intake capacity sanctioned/permitted by MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH/ for the said academic session shall not be approved.
15. There shall not be any institute-level Counselling through any mode. Any admissions made at the institute level shall not be approved by the NCISM/NCH/Concerned University. and the institute shall be penalized as per the provision laid down under sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of the NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020.
16. There shall not be any offline admission or admission without Counselling (Central/State/UT), and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved.
17. NCISM/NCH shall not approve admissions made without the original documents of the candidates
18. Admission made in violation of the NCISM/NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under the NCISM Act, 2020/NCH Act, 2020.
19. Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities such as offline admissions, admission without Counselling, and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity. In such case, students shall be discharged from the course and institution, and the institute will be subjected to face consequences as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020, and the person responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC/BNS concerned. whichever is applicable.
20. Admissions shall not be approved by any means after the cut-off date and time for admission as specified by NCISM/NCH.
21. No authority has the power to extend or modify the cut-off date of admission specified by NCISM/NCH, and such admissions shall not be approved.
22. No authority has the power to modify the intake capacity for admission into UG courses in ASU&H colleges sanctioned by MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH.
23. State/UT Counselling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure the eligibility of the candidate as laid down in respective NCISM (MSE-UG) Regulations 2022 and NCISM letter ref NCISM's letter no. BOA/2-B/UG/2026,11-76/2021-BUSS(Unani-U.G. RegI.), NCISM's letter no.18-12/2021-BUSS(SID-UG-MSE) dated 20.08.2026 for Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani for admissions in ASU-UG courses and NCH (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course – Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S). Regulations- 2022 and The National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course – Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S.) Amendment Regulations 2025 for admissions in Homoeopathy-UG courses by proper scrutiny of the relevant original certificates and documents at the time of admission.
24. AACCC, Ministry of Ayush will circulate the list of ineligible candidates to the State/UT Counselling Authority during the 3 & Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II) of AACCC-UG Counselling to prevent them from participating in the State/UT Counselling. State/UT Counselling Authorities are requested to ensure that such candidates have not been allotted any seat through any rounds of State/UT Counselling for admission in ASU&H-UG courses.
25. State/UT Counselling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure the authenticity and correctness of the details of admitted students before completing the admission procedures. Further, the ASU&H colleges/institutes should be instructed not to allow admissions without original documents. No modifications/ corrections after the cut-off date and time of admission as specified by NCISM/NCH shall be entertained.
26. All State/UT Counselling authorities are requested to ensure that the tuition fee, as laid down and fixed by respective governing or fee fixation committees as applicable, shall be charged in each academic session for four and half years only by the institutes. No tuition fee shall be charged for an extended study duration in case of failing examinations or for any other reasons, and there shall not be any fee for internship training at the same institute.

27. All Central/State/UT Counselling authorities are requested to ensure that the college should display tuition fees, hostel fees, and other fees, if any, on the institute's website and the Institute profile while uploading to the Central/State/UT Counselling Portal. The same is to be charged from the student at the time of admission. No other charges other than the displayed fees should be charged/collected

**II. Directives for State/UT Counselling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act)**

1. State/UT Counselling authorities shall conduct Counselling for 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under Central Act).
2. State/UT Counselling Authorities have to conduct Counselling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/ State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under Central Act) in adherence with guidelines/schedule provided by NCISM/NCH to avoid the overlapping of the schedule of AACCC Counselling and State or UT Counselling.
3. State/UT Counselling authorities should give wider publicity among NEET(UG)- 2026 qualified ASU&H-UG aspirants regarding the registration process of Counselling & provide sufficient time for registration before each round of Counselling for admission in AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU&H Institutes.
4. State/UT may decide on an all-inclusive application Cost/Non-refundable Registration Fee for Counselling for admission in ASU&H-UG seats for all category students. However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs 2000/-.
5. State/UT Counselling authorities shall conduct 2 rounds of Counselling for admission in 15% of All India Quota (AIQ) UG seats of Private ASU&H Institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act). The AIQ seats that remain vacant after the second round of State/UT Counselling may be transferred and converted to the State/UT Quota seats, and the same shall be filled up in further rounds as per State Government norms/ rules.
6. The Security money will be forfeited if a candidate does not join the Round-2 allotted seat or surrender/withdraw the seat Round-2 joined seat based on the candidate's request. Further, the Security money will also be forfeited if the Round-2 allotted seat is cancelled due to any unforeseen reason from the candidate's end. For example, the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration based on which a seat has been allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting or fails to produce the required original documents at the time of admission (within the stipulated time).
7. No domicile certificate is required for allotment of AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes.
8. Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ-UG seats in Private ASU&H Institutes: - all AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes are open in nature (all category candidates are eligible). However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise.
9. For PwD candidates, the PWD certificate should be as per the guidelines issued vide NCISM letter ref 1/1/2026-AACCC dated 25.07.2026/NCH letter ref 1-1/2026-AACCC dated 20.08.2026 (Available on Counselling website ([www.aaccc.gov.in](http://www.aaccc.gov.in))).
10. The admission on any other reserved quota seats in State shall be through Counselling authority designated by Central/State/UT Govt. only. Admissions done through any committee/local body/private organization members shall not be approved by NCISM/NCH.

## 5. GUIDELINES FOR STATE QUOTA SEATS

### FOLLOWING ARE THE CRITERIA TO DECIDE RAJASTHAN DOMICILE

- I. Natural father/Mother of the candidate has continuously resided in Rajasthan for period of last 10 years and the candidate has studied for at least 5 years during this period in a recognized educational institution in Rajasthan, or
- II. All those students who are Domicile residents of Rajasthan but are studying in other states will also be eligible for the allotment process, or
- III. The candidate is son/daughter of serving or retired
  - (i) Employee of Government of Rajasthan
  - (ii) Officer of All India Services borne on State Cadres of Rajasthan and has served for more than 3 years with State Government, or
- IV. The candidate is son/daughter of serving or retired, permanent employee of Govt. Undertaking / Corporation / Improvement Trust / Municipal Bodies / Council / Panchayat Samiti / Co-operative bodies, duly constituted by the Government of Rajasthan by an act of Law who has put in at least 3 years of service on the last date of submission of the on- line application form in the year of admission, or
- V. The candidate is son/daughter of serving/retired, permanent employee of any of the State University or Secondary Board of Education (Rajasthan) provided that employee has worked in Rajasthan for 3 years preceding the last date of submission of the on-line application form, or
- VI. Candidate is a natural son/daughter of a Serving/Retired permanent employee of Indian Defense and the employee is of Rajasthan origin irrespective of his place of posting. Provided that in case of Defense Personnel from Rajasthan origin, a certificate (certificate proforma –A) has to be submitted by them from the employer to the effect that his state of origin is Rajasthan at the time of his entry into service. Eligible candidates of this category shall be admitted as per laid down criteria of priority cum merit of the Rajasthan UG AYUSH Admissions - 2026, or
- VII. Candidate is a natural son/daughter of a Serving permanent employee of Indian Defense and the employee is posted in Rajasthan (certificate proforma – B) at the time of last date of submission of the on-line application form for admission, or
- VIII. Candidate is a son/daughter of serving/Retired person of Para-Military Forces of India and the employee is of Rajasthan origin, irrespective of his place of posting. Provided that in case of Para-Military personnel from the Rajasthan origin, a certificate (certificate proforma – A) has to be submitted by them from the employer to the effect that his state of origin is Rajasthan at the time of his entry into service, or
- IX. Candidate is a son/daughter of serving person of Para-Military Forces of India and the employee is posted in Rajasthan at the time of last date of submission of the on-line application form for admission (**certificate Proforma B**), or
- X. Candidate is a son/daughter of a Judge of Rajasthan High Court subject to the condition that he/she submits an undertaking/affidavit stating that such benefit is not being or availed by them in any other State,  
(Candidates falling in above clauses I to X are eligible for all types of seats, i.e. Govt./Management/NRI)
- XI. Other (for candidates who are not covered under the above clauses from I to X)  
(Candidates selecting clause XI "Other" are eligible to apply to participate but will be considered for allotment against vacant seats (Govt./Management/NRI) available after exhausting State Merit list during /after round 3).

(Candidates selecting clause XI "Other" and having NRI eligibility will be considered for allotment against NRI seats in all rounds according to the applicable norms) (Not eligible for State reservations)

The selected candidates will be required to undergo medical examination at the allotted institution on the notified date(s)

## 5.1 Eligibility for NRI Candidates

No reservation will apply on NRI seats of all private AYUSH UG colleges.

For admission under NRI Quota in AYUSH UG courses in private colleges of Rajasthan, priority shall be given to the NRI with ancestral background of the State of Rajasthan by own/parents/Grandparents resided in State of Rajasthan at least for a period of 5 years at any time. The proof of residence will also be applicable for the consideration priority for NRI Quota, for which document (Electricity/ Water bill/ Documents of immovable property/ Indian Passport/ Ration Card/ Voter ID/ Aadhaar Card etc.) to the effect for these criteria is required to be submitted by ward of NRI (including PIO/OCI).

Firstly, NRI Quota seats shall be allotted to candidate having ancestral background of the State of Rajasthan by own/parents/Grandparents resided in State of Rajasthan at least for a period of 5 years. Later on, remaining Vacant NRI seats will be allotted/ filled by the candidates of NRI belonging to other states.

For PIO / OCI: Overseas Citizens of India (OCI), Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) are allowed for admission under NRI Quota.

### NRI Seats Admission Procedure

**Out of total Seats in the private colleges, 15% seats shall be NRI seats. These will be filled as per rules and directions.**

#### GUIDELINES FOR NRI CANDIDATES

As per Order No. F.5(968) DME/LC/2018/1997 dated 29.04.2019 of Government of Rajasthan, (Annexure-3), following are the guidelines applicable for the admission in Under Graduate AYUSH courses under NRI Quota in all Private institutions of the State:

- a. At least one of the parents of student should be an NRI and shall ordinarily be residing abroad as an NRI, or
- b. The person who sponsors the student for admission should be a first-degree relation of the students (i.e., real Brother / real Sister) and should be ordinary residing abroad as an NRI; or
- c. If the Student has no parent or near relatives or taken as a ward by some other nearest relative, such students also may be considered for admission provide the guardian has Domicile treated the student as a ward. For this following nearest relative (NRI) of candidate can only be considered:
  - Real brother and sister of father i.e., real uncle and real aunt.
  - Real brother and sister of mother i.e., real maternal uncle and maternal aunt.
  - Father and mother of Father i.e., grandfather and grandmother.
  - Father and mother of mother i.e., maternal grandfather and maternal grandmother.
  - First degree-paternal and maternal cousins.
- d. NRI Candidate shall submit a Proof of being sponsored by NRI/OCI/PIO in the form of certificate issued by the Indian embassy /Ministry of external affairs, Government of India for this purpose. In the absence of certificate, a duly notarized undertaking executed by the sponsor and notarized by the Notary public of the foreign country where the sponsor resides being submitted by the sponsor, it be treated as sufficient as to the factum of the residence of the sponsor
- e. An affidavit from the sponsor that he/she looks after such student and will sponsor the entire course fee of the candidate
- f. Seats remaining vacant after exhausting NRI candidates would be converted in to general seats with fee decided for NRI seats on the basis of NEET-2026 score Merit. (Annexure-4)

#### **\*Documents required for NRI Candidates (Must upload during registration)**

1. Candidate shall submit a proof of being sponsored by NRI/OCI/PIO in the form of certificate issued by the Indian embassy/Ministry of external affairs, Government of India for this purpose. In the absence of that certificate a duly notarized undertaking executed by the sponsor and notarized by the Notary Public of the foreign country where the sponsor resides being submitted by the sponsor, it be treated as sufficient as to the factum of the residence of the sponsor.
2. An affidavit from the sponsor that he/she looks after such student and will sponsor the entire course fee of the candidate.

## 6. RESERVATION

### Kinds of seats and Reservations:

- a. 15% All India Quota seats of B.A.M.S./B.H.M.S./B.U.M.S. Courses in Private AYUSH institutions will be filled by the UG/PG AYUSH Counselling Board, Govt. of Rajasthan according to Govt. of India/NTA guidelines mentioned in information bulletin of NTA. However, 15% All India Quota seats of B.A.M.S./B.H.M.S./B.U.M.S. courses in Govt. AYUSH colleges will be filled by AACCC as per directions of Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India.
- b. Out of Total Seats in **MMM Govt. Ayurveda College, Udaipur 02 Seats** are Central Government Nomination to Under Graduate (UG) courses (BAMS) (1 for Tripura and 1 for Andaman & Nicobar Islands) & **05 Seats in Post Graduate Institute of Ayurveda, Jodhpur counselling** for North East States are reserved/remarked for Government of India under 'Central Pool' in few donor institutes of the country and are allotted to the students/candidates of the specific States/UT's, where the colleges of the respective system is not available, for studying Under Graduate (UG) Courses.  
*(Wide letter no Y-18011/2/2024-EP-III, Dated 07.05.2026 Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India)*
- c. 15 % of the total Seats are reserved for NRI Quota in all Private AYUSH Colleges.

**Note: -** The remaining seats shall be treated as the State Quota seats and will be filled up on merit cum preference in Rajasthan AYUSH Admissions 2026 with following reservations: -

**(Reservations on state level seats shall be as per existing orders of Government of Rajasthan as below)**

### State Reservations (Only applicable on Rajasthan Domicile Candidates)

- (i) 16% seats, excluding the seats of sub- clause (a), (b) & (c) above are reserved for natural born(not adopted) candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste as notified in the Presidential Order for the State of Rajasthan and who fulfill other relevant conditions.
- (ii) 12% seats, excluding the seats of sub-clauses (a), (b) &(c) above are reserved for natural born (not adopted) candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribe as notified in the Presidential Order for the State of Rajasthan and who fulfill other relevant conditions. *(45% of ST seats are to be for ST candidates who are Bonafide residents of scheduled area (tribal area) i.e., STA Seats;)*
- (iii) 21% seats, excluding the seats of sub-clauses (a), (b) &(c) above are reserved for those belonging to Other Backward Classes NCL (OBC NCL) of the State of Rajasthan and who fulfill other relevant conditions. **Candidate must submit valid OBC Certificate for Rajasthan State issued by competent authority of Rajasthan (clearly indicating 'Non-Creamy Layer'). Refer the direction letter no. 54159, dated 09.09.2015 issued by Social Justice and Empowerment Department, Govt. of Rajasthan, Jaipur.**
- (iv) 5% seats, excluding the seats of sub-clauses (a), (b) &(c) above are reserved for those belonging to Most Backward Classes NCL (MBC NCL) of the State of Rajasthan and who fulfill other relevant conditions. **Candidate must submit valid MBC-NCL Certificate for Rajasthan State issued by competent authority of Rajasthan (clearly indicating 'Non-Creamy Layer'). Refer the direction letter no. 54159, dated 09.09.2015 issued by Social Justice and Empowerment Department, Govt. of Rajasthan, Jaipur**
- (v) 10% seats, after excluding the seats of sub-clauses (a), (b) &(c) above are reserved for those belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) of the State of Rajasthan and who fulfill other relevant conditions. **Candidate must submit valid EWS Certificate for Rajasthan State issued by competent authority of Rajasthan (valid for financial year 2026-27). Refer the direction letter no. 28046, dated 06.05.2022 issued by Social Justice and Empowerment Department, Govt. of Rajasthan, Jaipur.**
- d. Not less than 25%, out of each category of SC, ST, STA, OBC-NCL, MBC-NCL, EWS and unreserved category shall be filled from female candidates.

### 6.1 (Reservation policy for Defence & Para Military Personnel)

1% seats (in Government colleges) after excluding the seats of sub clauses (a), (b) &(c) are reserved on priority cum merit for the natural born (not adopted) sons/daughters of Defence Personnel (serving / retired) of Rajasthan Origin, and para military personnel (serving / retired) of Rajasthan origin (in ratio 3:1). 50% out of these reserved seats shall be reserved for girls, unfilled seats will be reverted to boy's category

*As per the Kendriya Sainik Kalyan Board, the defence seat is admissible for only one member of the family, once in lifetime. Only wards of Defence Personnel from Army, Air Force & Navy from serial 1 to 9 below are eligible for the scheme. Candidate should bring an undertaking on Rs. 50 Non-Judicial Stamp paper for compliance of letter no. F25/SKV/2022/13423-30 Dated 13.10.2022 of Sainik Kalyan Vibhag, Govt. of Rajasthan.*



*As per letter no. 6(1)/2017/D (Res.II), dated 19.05.2017 and it's subsequent \amendments in Nov. 2017 and 21.05.2018 issued by Dept. of Ex- serviceman welfare, of Govt. of India and SOP letter no. 370/Adm/MBBS/BDS/c, dated 01.07.2020 of Kendriya Sainik Kalyan Board, Ministry of Defense, Govt. of India, priority order (certificate proforma 1) for Defence personnel of Rajasthan origin, will be as follows:*

1. (EXS1) Widows/Wards of Defence Personnel killed in action.
2. (EXS2) Wards of those Disabled in action and boarded out from service
3. (EXS3) Widows/Wards of those Defence personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service
4. (EXS4) Wards of those Disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service.
5. (EXS5) Wards of ex-service men and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Award. (i) Paramvir Chakra (ii) Ashok Chakra (iii) Mahavir Chakra (iv) Kirti Chakra (v) Veer Chakra
6. (EXS6) Wards of ex-service men.
7. (EXS7) Wives of (i) defence personnel killed in action and boarded out from service (ii) defence personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military services (iii) ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Award
8. (EXS8) Wards of serving personnel
9. (EXS9) Wives of serving personnel

*As per the letter no. F25/SKV/2022/13423-30 Dated 13.10.2022 of Sainik Kalyan Vibhag, Govt. of Rajasthan, the para-military seat is admissible for only one member of the family once in life time. According to the MHA (Ministry of Home Affairs), only wards of Para-military personnel from serial 1 to 3 below are eligible for the scheme. Candidate should bring an undertaking on Rs. 50 Non-Judicial Stamp paper for compliance of letter no. F25/SKV/2022/13423-30 Dated 13.10.2022 of Sainik Kalyan Vibhag, Govt. of Rajasthan.*

*Priority order (certificate proforma 2) for Para-military personnel of Rajasthan origin, will be as follows:*

1. Wards/ Widows /Wives of those Paramilitary personnel killed in action.
2. Wards/ Widows /Wives of those Paramilitary personnel permanently disabled in action and boarded out from service.
3. Wards of All serving and retired personnel.

## **6.2 Provisions relating to Persons with Disability (PwD)**

5% seats out of each category of 16% (SC), 12% (ST), 21% (OBC), 5% (MBC), 10% EWS and the remaining shall be further reserved on Merit-cum-Priority in each category horizontally for candidates with benchmark disabilities (PwBD/PwD) in accordance with Guidelines on assessment of persons with benchmark disabilities (PwBD/PwD) for admission to AYUSH Course 2026 issues by National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India, New Delhi vide Letter /Ref. No. BOA/AACCC/32/2024, dated 20.08.2026 (Annexure 1). The "Eligibility Certificate" issued by 62 centers of medical assessment boards approved by MCC for the academic year 2026-27 as per norms of Regulating Authority shall only be considered. List of approved centers is attached as Annexure 2.

*The candidate must bring the certificate issued to them, on the notified date for verification.*

**Note: Any unfilled seat(s) reserved for a particular category shall, subject to the applicable rules and prescribed conditions, be converted and filled from among the candidates belonging to the General Category, who fulfill the prescribed eligibility and other conditions as duly notified in the Online Counselling Schedule and the relevant Advertisement (Advt.)**

## **Seat Matrix**

The seat matrix for choice filling will be available on website in due course before every round. Responsibility of type of seats in the seat matrix shall lie with the concerned institution and not with the Counselling Board. It is on the part of the concerned AYUSH college to provide the categories of seats as well as fee to be charged for that category in accordance to the laws, rules and guidelines applicable to them.

## **Fee Structure and Other Charges**

The fee structure for the participating institutions/colleges, including tuition fees and other applicable charges, shall be made available separately on the Counselling Website under the "Fee Structure section. The details provided by the respective Institutions/Colleges shall be published on the Counselling Website, as and when received, for the information and ready reference of participating candidates.

The responsibility for the fee applicable to such seats shall rest solely with the concerned Institution/College and shall not be the responsibility of the State Counselling Board.

***Candidates are advised to carefully refer to the individual Institution/College website(s) for the latest details regarding the fee structure, other charges, admission formalities, rules, and any other applicable requirements before exercising their choices and/or taking admission.***

**Keep visiting the website regularly for notifications and updates regarding same.**



## 7. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Before filling the on-line application form, read the information bulletin and instructions for filling on-line application form etc. very carefully. You should be very careful in filling-up the on-line application form. If any lapse is detected during the scrutiny, your candidature will be rejected even if you come through the final stage of admission process or even at a later stage.

### 7.1 Important points to be taken care of:

#### First and Second Round of Admission Counselling

In the First and Second Rounds of Admission Counselling for the Academic Session 2026–27, allotment of seats under the 15% All India Quota (AIQ) and 85% State Quota shall be carried out simultaneously through the online counselling process, as per the following provisions:

#### a. 15% All India Quota (AIQ) – Private AYUSH Institutions:

For allotment against 15% All India Quota (AIQ) seats in Private AYUSH Undergraduate Institutions in Rajasthan, eligible candidates from Rajasthan as well as other States/Union Territories shall be considered, irrespective of their domicile status. The allotment of seats under this quota shall be made strictly on the basis of the overall merit/rank of the eligible candidates participating in the counselling, subject to the applicable eligibility criteria, reservation provisions, seat availability and other rules prescribed by the competent authority.

#### b. 85% State Quota – Government and Private AYUSH Institutions:

For allotment against 85% State Quota seats in Government and Private AYUSH Undergraduate Institutions in Rajasthan, only eligible candidates having Rajasthan domicile shall be considered. The allotment of seats under this quota shall be made on the basis of the merit/rank of eligible Rajasthan-domicile candidates, in accordance with the applicable reservation policy, category-wise merit, seat matrix, eligibility conditions and other rules prescribed by the competent authority.

#### c. Simultaneous Allotment:

The allotment process for 15% AIQ seats in Private AYUSH Institutions and 85% State Quota seats in Government and Private AYUSH Institutions shall be undertaken simultaneously in the same round of counselling. However, the candidates considered for each quota and the basis of merit for allotment shall be as specified above.

### 7.2 Important Instructions and Documents to Keep Ready Before Proceeding with Online Registration

Before proceeding with the online registration, candidates are advised to keep the following information, documents and certificates ready in the prescribed format, wherever applicable:

#### 1. Recent Colour Photograph:

A recent colour photograph of the candidate, as required for uploading during the online registration process.

#### 2. Signature:

A clear scanned image of the candidate's signature, as required for uploading during the online registration process.

#### 3. Eligibility Certificate/Document: (Domicile Certificate etc.)

Certificate/document supporting the eligibility criterion selected by the candidate at the time of filling the online application form, corresponding to Clauses I to XI specified under the Eligibility Criteria in the Information Booklet.

#### 4. Date of Birth Certificate:

10th class mark sheet/Birth Certificate/Transfer certificate/Valid Indian Passport, PAN card, or Driving License showing the date of birth (Aadhaar Card shall not be accepted as proof of date of birth)

#### 5. Senior Secondary Mark Sheet:

Mark sheet(s) of the Senior Secondary Examination (Class 12th) or equivalent examination.

#### 6. NEET (UG)-2026 score Card:

A copy of the NEET (UG)-2026 score Card, as applicable.

#### 7. Caste/EWS/Sub-Category Certificate: (If Applicable)

Valid Caste Certificate, EWS Certificate, and/or Sub-Category Certificate, as applicable, issued by the competent authority.

#### 8. PwD/PwBD Certificate: (If Applicable)

Valid PwD/PwBD Certificate, wherever applicable, in the prescribed Proforma attached with the Information Booklet and issued by the competent authority.

#### 9. Defence/Para-Military Certificate: (If Applicable)

Valid certificate/document in support of Ward of Defence Personnel/Ward of Para-Military Personnel, wherever applicable, in the prescribed format.

#### 10. Additional documents for candidates applying for NRI seats (If Applicable)

- A. If the Sponsor NRI/OCI/PIO is currently residing in India, a proof in the form of certificate issued by the Indian embassy in the concerned Country/Ministry of external affairs, Government of India for this purpose is essential along with undertaking in the prescribed Proforma-3 on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 50/- executed by Sponsor NRI/OCI/PIO and duly notarized. Or
- B. If the Sponsor NRI/OCI/PIO is residing outside India, a duly notarized undertaking in the prescribed Proforma-4 executed by the sponsor and notarized by the Notary Public of the foreign country where the sponsor resides being submitted by the sponsor, it be treated as sufficient as to the factum of the residence of the sponsor.
- C. NRI undertaking must have been issued on or after date of NEET 2026 examination i.e. 21.06.2026
- D. Father/Mother/Guardian shall also submit an undertaking regarding relationship between Sponsor and candidate in Proforma-5 along with the address of parents and local (Indian) guardian.
- E. Address proof of parents and local (Indian) guardian.

#### 11. Valid Photo Identity Document:

A valid photo identity document of the candidate, such as Driving Licence, PAN Card, Voter ID Card, Government/PSU Identity Card, School ID Card, Class 12th Examination Admit Card or Aadhaar Card.

#### 12. Bank Account Details:

A copy of the candidate's/Parent Bank Passbook or Cancelled Cheque, clearly showing the Account Holder's Name, Bank Account Number and IFSC Code, for the purpose of refund/payment-related processing, wherever applicable.

**Note: Candidates must ensure that all information furnished during online registration is correct and that the documents/certificates uploaded or produced are valid, complete and issued by the competent authority, wherever applicable. The original documents shall be required to be produced at the time of counselling/document verification as per the prescribed schedule.**

### 8. STEP-BY-STEP PROCEDURE FOR COUNSELLING, SEAT ALLOTMENT, REPORTING AND ADMISSION

#### 8.1 Step-1

##### UNDERTAKING by the Candidate that: -

*I hereby agree to and undertake to abide by all the terms and conditions governing the admission process for UG courses conducted by the Rajasthan NEET AYUSH UG/PG Counselling Board, Jaipur.*

- 1. I have gone through and understood the contents of information Brochure /Prospectus, relevant regulations and eligibility criteria prescribed therein. I shall abide by rules and admission process of UG BAMS/BUMS/BHMS/BNYS Seat as specified by the Rajasthan NEET AYUSH UG PG AYUSH Counselling Board, Jaipur.
- 2. I know the during verification of documents at the time of reporting, if any discrepancy is detected in original documents, including category, sub-category and gender, then I may not be considered for Allotment.
- 3. I know that the personal information provided by me is genuine and authentic.
- 4. I am aware of the fee, conditions of the institution that I am interested in and know that Rajasthan NEET AYUSH UG PG AYUSH Counselling Board, Jaipur has no role to play in that.
- 5. I have read and understood the Counselling scheme, notices and other relevant document uploaded on Counselling website.
- 6. I hereby declare that I shall not disclose, share, or otherwise provide my password to any other person. I understand that I am solely responsible for safeguarding and maintaining the confidentiality of my password. The Rajasthan NEET AYUSH UG/PG Counselling Board, Jaipur shall not be responsible or liable for any misuse, unauthorized access, or consequences arising from the disclosure or compromise of my password.

**Note: Candidates are strictly advised not to disclose or share their password with anyone and to keep it confidential and secure at all times.**

**IMPORTANT: HAND WRITTEN / TYPED / PHOTOSTAT COPIES / PRINTED APPLICATION FORM / SCREEN PRINTOUT WILL NOT BE ENTERTAINED.**

## 8.2 Step-2

### Commencement of Admission Process:

The admission process shall initially commence with the publication of the Provisional Merit List for the First Round of counselling.

### Pre-Document Verification: PwD, Defence/Para-Military, and NRI

Pre-document verification shall be conducted prior to the commencement of the First Round of counselling for candidates belonging to the PwD, Defence/Para-Military, and NRI categories (Category-1, 2 & 3), as per the orders issued by the Government of Rajasthan. The document verification shall be carried out at the NEET AYUSH Counselling Board Office, AYUSH Bhawan, Sector-26, Pratap Nagar, Jaipur. Candidates shall be required to appear in person with all original documents along with two sets of self-attested photocopies thereof, within the prescribed schedule.

In case a sufficient number of eligible candidates of NRI Quota are not available after completion of the pre-document verification process, the vacant seats shall be converted into Category-IV (NRI Quota) in accordance with the orders/directions issued by the Government of Rajasthan, subject to deposit of the prescribed NRI Quota fee. Candidates seeking admission against such seats shall be required to opt for the NRI Quota while filling the online choice-filling/option form.

Further, if any NRI Quota and/or Defence Quota seats remain vacant after completion of the reporting process of the First Round of counselling, candidates desirous of being considered for admission against such vacant seats shall be required to appear in person before the Counselling Board for document verification within the schedule notified by the Counselling Board. Personal appearance before the Counselling Board for document verification shall be mandatory. No candidate shall be considered for allotment against such vacant NRI Quota and/or Defence Quota seats unless he/she appears in person and successfully completes the document verification process within the prescribed schedule. Verification through an authorised representative, online mode, or any other means shall not be permitted.

## 8.3 Step-3

Publishing of provisional merit list (1st Round) for all state Quota seats and 15% all India Quota seats of private institutions/private university as per categories.

## 8.4 Step-4

### Choice Filling

8.4.1 Deposit the counselling fee online and Choice filling.

***Important: Always verify and save all your selected choices on the Counselling Portal before exiting. After saving, carefully check that your choices have been recorded correctly and print the Choice Filling Confirmation page for your records and submission during reporting. Please note that unsaved choices will not be considered for seat allotment, and screenshots or claims will not be accepted as valid proof of unsaved entries.***

### Counselling Fee/Security Money

8.4.2 Counselling Fee/Security Money: INR 25,000/- must be deposited as counselling fee through Net banking/Debitcard/Credit Card before the choice filling for BAMS/BHMS/BUMS/BNYS seats. This fee will be a part of tuition fee of a candidate who joins his college later on.

8.4.3 Candidates who have been allotted seats have to deposit their annual college fee with adjustment of counselling fee through **online or demand draft** in Favor of **CHAIRMAN, AYUSH UG ADMISSION COUNSELLING BOARD, (Payable at Jaipur)** during stipulated period of time. This candidate will also be eligible for 2<sup>nd</sup> round of counselling for upgradation if he/she fills fresh choice filling form for 2<sup>nd</sup> round.

8.4.4 If a candidate fails to report to the designated reporting center, fails to deposit the prescribed remaining annual college fee and fails to submit the required original documents within the stipulated period, his/her allotment shall stand cancelled and the allotted seat shall be treated as vacant; however, such candidate may participate in the Second Round of Counselling as a last chance, without forfeiture of the Counselling Fee/Security Money, subject to the condition that he/she submits a fresh choice-filling form for the Second Round. Such candidate shall have no claim whatsoever over the seat allotted in the previous round, and shall be considered afresh for seat allotment in the Second Round, which shall be made subject to the availability of seats and strictly on the basis of the fresh merit list and choices submitted by the candidate.

8.4.5 The counselling fee (Security Money) shall stand forfeited if a candidate, after allotment of a seat in the Second Round or any subsequent round: (i) fails to report to the Counselling Board within the stipulated time, where "reporting" means payment of the prescribed admission fee and submission of all original documents within the prescribed time OR (ii) remains absent from the admission process before the Counselling Board; or (iii) surrenders the allotted seat after allotment for any reason whatsoever, including unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances.

"The counselling fee shall be forfeited if the admission of a candidate is cancelled for any reason. This includes, but is not limited to, cases where the candidate provides incorrect, false, or misleading information during registration—on the basis of which a seat is allotted—or fails to produce the required documents within the stipulated time when reporting for admission."

8.4.6 In case a candidate is not allotted any seat in any round of the admission counselling, the counselling fee shall be refunded only after the completion of the entire counselling process, as per the prescribed procedure.

#### **Refund of Counselling Fee**

8.4.7 If a candidate is not allotted any seat in any round of the admission counselling, the counselling fee shall be refunded only after the completion of the entire counselling process, as per the prescribed procedure.

8.4.8 The refund shall be credited only to the bank account furnished by the candidate at the time of registration. Therefore, candidates are advised to ensure that the bank account details provided during registration, including the Account Holder's Name, Bank Name, Account Number, and IFSC Code, are correct and complete. The counselling authority shall not be responsible for any delay or failure in processing the refund due to incorrect or incomplete bank details furnished by the candidate.

8.4.9 No request, representation, or grievance regarding the refund of the counselling fee shall be entertained during the pendency of the counselling process. Such requests, if any, may be submitted only after the completion of the entire counselling process and in accordance with the prescribed procedure.

#### **REPORTING CUM JOINING BY CANDIDATES (ONLY ALLOTTED CANDIDATE) AS PER ALLOTMENT LIST**

- Downloading Allotment Letter & Reporting Instructions
- Candidates allotted a seat in the any round of counselling are required to:
  1. Download the Allotment Letter from the official portal.
  2. Report in person at the Office of the Counselling Board with the following:
  3. At the time of reporting, the candidate shall be required to submit/deposit the following documents:
    - i. A copy of the Rajasthan AYUSH Counselling Application Form. (self-attested)
    - ii. A copy of the NEET Score Card and NEET Admit Card.(self-attested)
    - iii. All original documents as prescribed in the Information Booklet. (Scanned, color photo copy shall not be accepted in the absence of the original documents)
    - iv. One set of self-attested, clear photocopies of all required documents, along with a photocopy of the Demand Draft, wherever applicable.
    - v. A Demand Draft for the prescribed fee of the allotted college, drawn in favor of "**Chairman, AYUSH UG Admission Counselling Board, Jaipur**", to be submitted at the time of reporting. The prescribed fee may also be deposited through online mode, as per the applicable instructions. Cash/Cheque shall not be accepted under any circumstances.
    - vi. A Notarized Undertaking in the prescribed format (Proforma-06) regarding the correctness and authenticity of the documents submitted by the candidate, executed on non-judicial stamp paper of INR 50/-.
  4. Upgraded candidates shall be required to submit the **Previous Round Allotment Letter and Fee Receipt**, along with the **payment of the difference in fee if any**, wherever applicable.

***Failure to comply with the above requirements shall lead to cancellation of the allotted seat.***

***Important - Candidates must deposit their original documents along with one set of self-attested photocopies at the time of reporting. If a candidate fails to deposit the original documents and does not obtain the system-generated Admission letter 2026 Fee Receipt duly signed by the Counselling Authorities, their seat will be cancelled and the candidate will be treated as 'Absent'***

Candidates are directed to visit website on regular basis in every round of counselling process.

### **8.7 Step-7**

#### **Surrender of seats**

If a candidate is willing to surrender his/her seat allotted at the 1st round of counselling then he/she will have to appear in person at the office of Counselling Board, Jaipur along with application and system-generated Admission letter 2026 Fee Receipt duly signed by the Counselling Authorities to surrender the seat.

*Only candidates allotted seats in Round 1 will be eligible for a refund of the counselling fee, provided they surrender their allotted seat **before the release of the Round 2 schedule**. Candidates allotted seats in Round 2 or any subsequent round who surrender their seats thereafter will not be entitled to a refund of the counselling fee*

### Eligible for 2nd Round of Counselling

Candidates eligible for seat allotment in 2nd round would be from one of the following groups:-

Group-I: Fresh, new eligible candidates, who have not registered in 1<sup>st</sup> round of counselling.

Group-II: Registered candidates who did not get any seat allotment in the 1st round.

Group-III: Registered candidates who have secured a seat under the Reserved Quota, but whose Round 1 allotted seat is cancelled during document verification at the time of reporting for admission due to non-submission or insufficiency of the required documents, will also be considered for seat allotment in the subsequent round based on their application for change of category to the revised category, subject to the availability of seats in the respective category.

Group-IV: Candidates who have reported during 1st round of allotment and willing to upgradation.

Group- V: Candidates who have been allotted a seat in Round 1 but have not reported before the Counselling Board will be permitted to fill fresh choices for the subsequent round of seat allotment, subject to the availability of seats.

### Not eligible for 2nd Round of Counselling

Candidate who has become non eligible due to having inadequate documents as per Eligibility Criteria.

### Important Instructions for Upgradation / Upgraded Candidates

#### 1. Fresh Choices in Every Round:

Candidates seeking upgradation must fill in fresh choices in every counselling round as per the notified schedule. Choices filled in the previous round shall NOT be considered for subsequent rounds.

#### 2. Careful Filling of Choices:

Candidates are advised to fill their choices carefully and only for those colleges in which they genuinely wish to be upgraded. Upgradation shall be available only against seats available in the respective counselling round and shall be made strictly on the basis of merit and category. If a candidate is allotted a new college in any subsequent counselling round, his/her previously allotted seat shall automatically stand CANCELLED, as the previously allotted seat shall simultaneously be allotted to another eligible candidate as per merit and category.

*No request, representation, or grievance for retention of the previously allotted college shall be entertained after upgradation.*

#### 3. Mandatory Personal Reporting After Upgradation:

If a candidate is upgraded in any subsequent counselling round, he/she must report **in person before the Counselling Board**. Reporting directly to the upgraded college, through e-mail, or by any other mode will not be considered valid.

#### 4. Failure to Report After Upgradation:

If a candidate is allotted an upgraded seat but fails to report as required, both the original and upgraded seats will be cancelled. The tuition fee (if deposited), it will be refunded only after the completion of the counselling process; *however, the counselling fee will be forfeited and will not be refunded.*

#### 5. No Upgradation in Subsequent Round:

If a candidate is not upgraded in a subsequent round, he/she may directly report to the concerned college as per the schedule and notification.

**Note: - Candidates are advised to carefully follow the above instructions and the counselling schedule to avoid cancellation of their seats.**

### Subsequent rounds of Counselling

Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Information Booklet/Rules, subsequent rounds of counselling, wherever required, shall be conducted in accordance with the schedule, cut-off date prescribed by the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India, from time to time, and as notified by the Competent Authority.

**Physical verification of documents and physical reporting shall be required in accordance with the provisions of this Information Booklet and/or any subsequent notification issued by the Counselling Board.**

- Allotment of seats through counselling process of all successful and registered candidates through NEET-2026 result shall be conducted for all the candidates who appeared in NEET- 2026, strictly in accordance with the merit list prepared on the basis of All India Merit in NEET-2026. However, for the BNYS course, the seat allotment criteria are specified separately on Page No. 03.
- Candidates once allotted seat and college in 1st Round, must deposit their annual college fee for the session 2026-27 at reporting center decided by Counselling Board, Jaipur within stipulated period of time. Only then they will be eligible for upgradation in 2<sup>nd</sup> round if they desire so to change college/course. Annual college fee will be accepted only through DD/Online payment as per limit of the particular UPI application, in favor of

**CHAIRMAN, AYUSH UG ADMISSION COUNSELLING BOARD,**

**(Payable at JAIPUR),**

- Seats allotted to candidates up to and including the Second Round of counselling shall ordinarily be considered final, and such candidates shall not be eligible to participate in any subsequent round of counselling. However, the Counselling Board reserves the right, in exceptional circumstances, to permit such candidates to participate in further rounds, particularly where seats become vacant in Government institutions and are required to be filled in accordance with the merit order, or where a new college is added during the ongoing counselling process. Any such participation shall be subject to the availability of seats and such terms, conditions, and directions as may be issued by the Counselling Board from time to time.
- If a candidate allotted a seat in the Second Round or any subsequent round of counselling fails to report at the designated reporting center within the stipulated time to complete admission formalities, including deposition of prescribed fee and submission of original documents, or surrenders the allotted seat, the allotment shall stand cancelled automatically. The counselling fee shall be forfeited, and the candidate may be debarred from further rounds of counselling. No claim for restoration of seat or refund of counselling fee shall be entertained under any circumstances.
- In the event that a candidate furnishes any false, incorrect, or misleading information at the time of online application or choice filling, on the basis of which a seat is provisionally allotted, and such allotment is subsequently cancelled by the Admission/Counselling Authority at the time of reporting due to failure in verification of the claimed documents or eligibility criteria, the counselling fee

deposited by the candidate shall be forfeited. Further, such cancellation shall be final and binding, and the candidate shall have no claim whatsoever to the allotted seat or refund of the counselling fee.

- Those who applied but not allotted a seat in first round as well as second round will be considered for subsequent round of counselling (without fresh application form i.e., need not to fill the application form again).
- A candidate who fails to produce and submit the **original certificates/documents** at the time of reporting shall **not be permitted to take admission** at the allotted Reporting Centre **under any circumstances**.
- Further, after successful verification of documents and **deposit of the prescribed admission fee**, the candidate shall be required to **deposit all original certificates/documents with the Counselling Board**. The original documents so deposited shall be **handed over to the concerned Institute/College only after completion of the entire counselling process**, as per the directions of the Counselling Board.
- The list of provisionally allotted candidates for each round of counselling shall be made available to the respective colleges through the official portal of the Counselling Board, and the colleges shall verify the credentials and eligibility of the reporting candidates strictly in accordance with the provisional allotment list after each round. Any discrepancy, deficiency or mismatch noticed during verification shall be mandatorily reported to the Counselling Board through the prescribed mode before the commencement of the subsequent round of counselling, failing which the concerned college shall be solely responsible for the consequences arising therefrom. During the ongoing counselling process of the academic session, the college shall not retain any original documents of the candidate except the Migration Certificate and Transfer Certificate, as applicable, and shall allow the candidate to join provisionally only upon submission of the original Admission Letter-cum-Fee Receipt duly issued and signed by the Counselling Authority.
- All admissions made through this counselling process shall be purely provisional and subject to the final outcome of any pending case(s), litigation, writ petition(s), appeal(s), or order(s) passed by any competent court of law, including the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and/or the Hon'ble High Court, as applicable to these admissions, or as may be directed from time to time.
- In the event of any adverse order or direction passed by a competent court or authority at any stage, the Admission Authority/University/Government shall have the right to modify, cancel, or withdraw such admission without any prior notice, and no claim for equity, damages, or continuation of admission shall be entertained.
- Further, upon completion of the entire admission process, the consolidated list of admitted candidates shall be forwarded to the concerned affiliating University. The admission of a candidate shall be deemed finally confirmed only after successful enrolment/registration by the concerned University and subject to compliance with all statutory requirements, eligibility conditions, and court directions, if any.

- In the event that any new AYUSH college is permitted to participate during the ongoing counselling process, the seats of such college(s) shall be offered in the subsequent round(s) strictly in accordance with the merit order of all eligible and registered candidates, as per the applicable counselling rules and preferences.
- Candidates are advised to visit Counselling Board website and daily newspapers time to time for information of dates and other information for conducting various rounds of counselling.
- In the event that vacant seats under the AACCC (AIQ) are transferred to the Counselling Board, Rajasthan, admissions to such residual vacant seats shall be carried out through subsequent rounds of counselling, if required, by the NEET UG/PG AYUSH Counselling Board, Rajasthan, on the basis of fresh/valid application and merit, in accordance with the prescribed counselling procedure and applicable guidelines.

#### **REPORTING TO COLLEGE AFTER COUNSELLING/JOINING TIME**

- Each candidate shall join the allotted college and course within the joining period specified in the provisional allotment letter issued online, and no extension shall be granted under any circumstances. The allotment shall be final for that counselling round, subject to the upgradation/subsequent-round provisions notified by the Counselling Board. No request for change of the allotted college/course shall be entertained after allotment; however, candidates may opt for the Second or subsequent rounds of counselling for change of college/course, as per the applicable rules.

- While reporting for admission, candidates must deposit Migration & TC in original to the allotted institute.
- The selected candidates will be required to undergo medical examination at the allotted institution on the notified date(s).
- Provided that if any candidate is not able to report for Medical Examination at the Institution on the notified date on medical grounds or due to some other circumstances beyond his/her control and his/her parent/guardian comes in person on his/her behalf for verification of the original certificates to the college he/she will be considered for provisional admission. His / Her formal admission will be confirmed only when he/she is found medically fit and fulfills other requirements as per the dates notified.
- Candidates who fail to attend medical examination on the notified date are liable to forfeit the claim for admission.
- Candidates who have been admitted must join their classes on the date to be notified.
- The selection for this admission will be cancelled if the selected candidates do not report to the allotted college up to the stipulated date or whose particulars are not found correct or who are found medically unfit.
- The candidates must present an accepted resignation letter/relieving letter from the institution where they are currently pursuing their studies at the time of reporting. Failure to produce the required document will result in disqualification from admission.

### IMPERSONATION

1. If at any stage, it is found that any candidate has indulged in any case of impersonation, i.e., the photograph, signature, documents, or other identification particulars do not match those of the candidate, he/she will be handed over to the Police and the matter will be dealt with in accordance with the applicable provisions of the **Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (BNS)** and other applicable laws. If required, the matter may be handed over to the Police for further investigation. Such candidates will be permanently debarred from taking admission to BAMS/BUMS/BHMS/BNYS courses in future.
2. The apex court drew guidelines for the management of all educational institutions to follow. Among them: educational institutions should take anti-ragging measures right from the time of advertisement for admissions. The prospectus, the form for admission and/or any other literature issued to aspirants for admission must clearly mention that ragging is banned in the institution and anyone indulging in it is likely to be punished appropriately which may include expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.

The punishment may also take the shape of: (i) withholding scholarships or other benefits (ii) debarring from representation in events (iii) withholding results (iv) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess. If there be any legislation governing ragging or any provisions in statute/ordinance, it should be brought to the notice of the students/parents seeking admissions. A printed leaflet detailing when and to whom a victim may turn for information, help and guidance for various purposes, keeping in view the needs of new entrants, along with their addresses and telephone numbers should be given to fresher at the time of admissions so that they need not to look to seniors for help in such matters.

3. If, for reasons to be recorded in writing, the Counselling Board suspects that a particular candidate has obtained a certificate by misrepresenting facts, the matter will be referred to the concerned D.M. On receipt of the enquiry report, the Counselling Board shall take the final decision regarding the admission of the Candidate.

With reference to the subject mentioned above I am hereby directed to inform you that all participating candidates of ASU UG Counseling 2026 who want to apply under PwBD category that in compliance with the directives issued by NMC

The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in respect of M.A. No. 378/2025 in CA No. 14333/2024, an Appellate Body has been constituted for disability assessment and facilitation of PwBD candidates. The venue for the Assessment Board in Delhi shall be Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi (Constitution of board enclosed as Annexure-II).

Further, the BOA and BUSS, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) decided to review Appendix A and B of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022 with the objective to align the guidelines with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 in its joint board meeting held on 19.08.2026

In this respect, both the boards unanimously agreed to adopt the "Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for Admission to the MBBS Course", 2026 issued on 27.07.2026 issued by NMC, for the admissions in ASU courses in AY 2026-27 (copy enclosed) to ensure parity and standardization across medical education systems

Accordingly, the NCISM has resolved that all candidates with benchmark disabilities, who possess a valid UDID card issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) and further meet the NEET UG eligibility criteria, shall be considered for admission in BAMS/BUMS/BSMS course under the PwBD category.

Further, it is informed that, the following documents must be mandatorily submitted by PwBD candidates at the time of reporting to designated disability centers of MCC for obtaining disability certificates for the academic year 2026-27:

- NEET UG 2026 result demonstrating eligibility for the BAMS/BUMS/BSMS course.
- Valid UDID card (Yellow or above) issued by the DEPwD (excluding visual disabilities)
- Self-certified affidavits in the prescribed format, specific to the candidate's disability category, as provided in Schedule-I (Copy enclosed)
- The candidate will have to approach the designated Medical Board for verification of **their self-certified affidavits.**

In light of above facts, PwBD candidates participating in UG Counseling 2026 for Ayurveda, Unani & Siddha (ASU) courses, are advised to note the following points w.r.t obtaining Disability Certificate for the purpose of upcoming NEET UG Counseling, from designated disability centers of MCC:

- Candidates who wish to claim All India Quota seat under PwBD category are required to visit one of the 62 designated disability centres of MCC (List enclosed) and submit following documents at the centre to obtain the Disability certificate
  - NEET UG 2026 result demonstrating eligibility for the BAMS/BUMS/BSMS course.
  - Valid UDID card (Yellow or above) issued by the DEPwD (excluding visual disabilities)
  - Self-certification form in the prescribed format of NCISM as provided in Appendix-A (Copy enclosed)
  - Affidavits, specific to the candidate's disability category, in the prescribed format of NCISM as provided in Appendix-A to F (Copy enclosed)
- The certificate will be generated by the center as per details of disability mentioned on the UDID card, affidavit submitted by the PwBD candidate, fulfillment of eligibility criteria subject to Board assessment of functional competencies.
- For disabilities other than the one already discussed in respect of Locomotor, Hearing, Visual and SLD/ASD/ Mental Illness, they will have to submit a valid UDID card and the self-certified affidavit prescribed in Appendix-A under the category "Others".
- Only those candidates who have obtained Disability certificate from a designated center of MCC will be shown choices of PwBD seats for All India Quota.
- The disability certificate will be valid for this academic session only.
- Candidates who wish to avail PwBD seat under 85% State quota can visit state disability boards for obtaining certificates. However, evaluation has to be conducted by the state disability boards as per NCISM Guidelines (2026)

### NATIONAL COMMISSION FOR INDIAN SYSTEM OF MEDICINE MINISTRY OF AYUSH, GOVERNMENT OF INDIA

**Subject: Addendum regarding the applicability of the Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for admission to Undergraduate ASU Courses, 2026-27**

1. Attention is invited to the provisions relating to admission of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) to the BAMS/BUMS/BSMS Courses, 2026-27 and the *Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for Admission to the MBBS Course, 2026*, notified vide Notification No. U-11021/24204/2026-UGMEB dated 27.07.2026.
2. Attention is also invited to Office Memorandum No. 18-25/2024-Policy dated 17.12.2025 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, regarding the validity of Temporary UDID Cards/Disability Certificates for extending statutory benefits to eligible persons with benchmark disabilities.
3. Accordingly, for admission to the **Undergraduate ASU Courses (BAMS/BUMS/BSMS)** under the PwBD category, the provisions of the aforesaid Guidelines dated 27.07.2026 shall be taken into consideration, as applicable, and read harmoniously with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the aforesaid Office Memorandum dated 17.12.2025.
4. Therefore, for the purposes of admission to the Undergraduate ASU Courses:
  - (i) A candidate shall not be denied consideration solely on the ground that the UDID Card or Disability Certificate is temporary, where the disability is categorized as “progressive, non-progressive or not likely to improve”, subject to verification by the Medical Assessment Board.
  - (ii) In cases of candidates holding Temporary UDID Cards where the disability condition is recorded as “likely to improve”, the Medical Assessment Board shall re-assess the benchmark disability as per the applicable assessment methodology prescribed by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), including the methodology prescribed vide Notification dated 12.03.2024.
  - (iii) The Medical Assessment Board shall independently assess the candidate's functional competency in accordance with the applicable PwBD assessment provisions before issuing the requisite Eligibility Certificate.
5. This clarification is issued to ensure uniform implementation in respect of PwBD candidates seeking admission to BAMS/BUMS/BSMS Courses and shall be read as an integral part of the applicable admission provisions for the academic session 2026-27.
6. This issues with the approval of the Competent Authority.

**NOTIFICATION**

**GUIDELINES ON ASSESSMENT OF PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES (PwBD) FOR ADMISSION TO THE MBBS COURSE, 2026**

**U-11021/24204/2026-UGMEB**-In exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 24 of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, read with Section 57 thereof, and in furtherance of the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023, the National Medical Commission hereby issues the following Guidelines, namely: —

**1. Short Title and Commencement**

1.1 These Guidelines may be called the "Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for Admission to the MBBS Course, 2026".

1.2 They shall come into force on the date of their publication by the National Medical Commission.

**2. Objectives**

2.1 The National Medical Commission recognizes that Persons with Benchmark Disabilities constitute an integral part of society and are entitled to equality, dignity, non-discrimination and reasonable accommodation in all spheres of life, including medical education, in accordance with the Constitution of India and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

2.2 Simultaneously, the National Medical Commission is entrusted with the statutory responsibility of maintaining high standards of undergraduate medical education and ensuring that every medical graduate acquires the essential competencies necessary for the safe, ethical and effective practice of modern medicine in accordance with the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum.

2.3 Medical education demands the acquisition of knowledge, professional skills, clinical competencies, communication abilities and ethical values. The assessment of candidates with benchmark disabilities must therefore balance the rights guaranteed under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with the statutory obligation to maintain academic standards, professional competence and patient safety.

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2.4 These Guidelines introduce a competency-based and function-oriented assessment framework, whereby the determination of eligibility shall not rest solely upon the numerical percentage or category of disability reflected in the UDID Card or other disability certification. While the benchmark disability prescribed under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 shall continue to determine eligibility for reservation under the PwBD category, admission to the MBBS Course shall be based upon an objective evaluation of the candidate's functional competencies, with due regard to reasonable accommodation, assistive technology, environmental accessibility and contemporary advances in rehabilitation science.

2.5 For the purposes of these Guidelines, the certificate presently issued by the designated Medical Boards for admission to the MBBS Course, though commonly referred to as a "**Disability Certificate**", shall be known as the "**Eligibility Certificate**", as it is intended to certify the candidate's eligibility or otherwise for admission to the MBBS Course based on functional assessment rather than merely certifying the existence or extent of disability.

2.6 In order to facilitate greater accessibility, transparency and uniformity in the assessment process, the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, expanded the designated assessment centers from 16 (Sixteen) to 61 (Sixty One) across the country and any further expansion of such assessment boards will be notified by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) from time to time. For the purposes of these Guidelines, all such designated Boards shall be referred to as the "Medical Assessment Boards", which shall undertake the functional assessment of candidates in accordance with these Guidelines.

2.7 These Guidelines accordingly establish a transparent, uniform, evidence-based and competency-oriented framework for the assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities seeking admission to the MBBS Course throughout the country, with the objective of ensuring equal opportunity while preserving academic standards, professional competence and patient safety.

### 3. Definitions

In these Guidelines, unless the context otherwise requires—

**3.1 "Act"** means the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 (30 of 2019).

**3.2 "Medical Assessment Board"** means an Assessment Board designated or constituted by the Medical Counselling Committee for assessing the functional competency and eligibility of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities for admission to the MBBS Course under these Guidelines.

**3.3 "PwBD Candidate"** means a person seeking admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) category through the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (Undergraduate) [NEET (UG)].

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**3.4"CBME"** means the Competency Based Medical Education curriculum prescribed by the National Medical Commission from time to time.

**3.5"Competency"** means the knowledge, skills, attitudes, values and professional behaviors prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education curriculum required to successfully complete the MBBS Course.

**3.6 "Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)"** means the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

**3.7"Disability Certificate"** means the certificate issued by the Medical Assessment Board designated by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) under the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, certifying the eligibility or otherwise of a Person with Benchmark Disability for admission to the MBBS Course in accordance with these Guidelines.

NOTE: For the purposes of these Guidelines, the certificate presently issued by the designated Medical Boards for admission to the MBBS Course, though commonly referred to as a **"Disability Certificate"**, shall be known as the **"Eligibility Certificate"**, as it is intended to certify the candidate's eligibility or otherwise for admission to the MBBS Course based on functional assessment rather than merely certifying the existence or extent of disability.

**3.8"Essential Competencies"** means the minimum competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education curriculum that every medical graduate is required to acquire for the safe and effective practice of medicine.

**3.9"Functional Competency"** means the demonstrated ability of a candidate, with or without reasonable accommodation or assistive technology, to acquire and perform the essential competencies required under the Competency Based Medical Education curriculum.

**3.10"Graduate Medical Education Regulations" or "GMER"** means the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023, as amended from time to time.

**3.11"Guidelines"** means these Guidelines on Assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) for Admission to the MBBS Course, 2026.

**3.12"Medical College"** means a medical institution recognized under the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 for conducting the MBBS Course.

**3.13"Medical Counselling Committee (MCC)"** means the Medical Counselling Committee constituted by the Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.

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**3.14 "National Medical Commission" or "NMC"** means the National Medical Commission established under Section 3 of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019.

**3.15 "NEET (UG)"** means the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (Undergraduate) conducted for admission to undergraduate medical education in accordance with the applicable law.

**3.16 "Notification of 12th March, 2024"** means the Notification dated 12th March, 2024 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, published in the Gazette of India on 14th March, 2024.

**3.17 "Person with Benchmark Disability" or "PwBD"** shall have the same meaning as assigned to it under Section 2(r) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

**3.18 "Reasonable Accommodation"** shall have the same meaning as assigned to it under Section 2(y) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

**3.19 "Rules"** means the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017, as amended from time to time.

**3.20 "Specified Disability"** shall have the same meaning as assigned to it under the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

**3.21 "State Counselling Authority"** means the authority designated by the respective State Government or Union Territory Administration to conduct counselling for admission to the MBBS Course.

**3.22 "Self-certified Affidavit"** means the affidavit furnished by a candidate in the format prescribed in Schedule-I declaring the candidate's functional abilities and other particulars required under these Guidelines.

**3.23 "Speaking Order"** means a written order containing the reasons, findings and conclusions of the Medical Assessment Board in support of its decision.

**3.24 "Reasoned Decision"** means a decision supported by objective findings, functional assessment and reasons recorded in writing.

**3.25 "UDID Card"** means the Unique Disability Identity Card issued through the Unique Disability Identity (UDID) Portal by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

## CHAPTER I

### PRELIMINARY

#### 4. Scope and Application

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4.1. These Guidelines shall apply to—

- (a) every candidate seeking admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) category;
- (b) every Medical College recognized under the National Medical Commission Act, 2019;
- (c) the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC);
- (d) all State Counselling Authorities;
- (e) all Medical Assessment Boards constituted for assessment of PwBD candidates; and
- (f) every authority or institution involved in the assessment, counselling, admission or certification of candidates under the PwBD category.

## **5. Objectives**

5.1. The National Medical Commission recognizes that Persons with Benchmark Disabilities constitute an integral part of society and are entitled to equality, dignity, non-discrimination and reasonable accommodation in all spheres of life, including medical education, in accordance with the Constitution of India and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

5.2. Simultaneously, the National Medical Commission is entrusted with the statutory responsibility of maintaining high standards of undergraduate medical education and ensuring that every medical graduate acquires the essential competencies necessary for the safe, ethical and effective practice of modern medicine in accordance with the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum.

5.3. Medical education demands the acquisition of knowledge, professional skills, clinical competencies, communication abilities and ethical values. The assessment of candidates with benchmark disabilities must therefore balance the rights guaranteed under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with the statutory obligation to maintain academic standards, professional competence and patient safety.

5.4. Disability shall not, by itself, constitute a ground for exclusion from medical education. Eligibility shall be determined through an objective assessment of the candidate's functional competencies, taking into consideration reasonable accommodation, assistive technology, environmental accessibility and contemporary advances in rehabilitation science.

5.5. These Guidelines seek to establish a transparent, uniform, evidence-based and competency-oriented framework for the assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities seeking admission to the MBBS Course throughout the country.

## **6. Statutory Framework**

6.1. These Guidelines shall be read in conjunction with—

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- (a) the National Medical Commission Act, 2019;
- (b) the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016;
- (c) the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023, as amended from time to time;
- (d) the Notification dated 12th March, 2024 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment;
- (e) all applicable Regulations, Guidelines, Notifications and Circulars issued by the National Medical Commission from time to time; and
- (f) all binding judgments, directions and orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and other competent Courts governing admission of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities to the MBBS Course.

## **7. Purpose**

7.1 The purpose of these Guidelines is to—

- (a) establish a uniform national framework for assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities seeking admission to the MBBS Course;
- (b) ensure transparency, consistency and objectivity in disability assessment;
- (c) facilitate implementation of the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023;
- (d) ensure compliance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016;
- (e) promote equality, inclusion and reasonable accommodation while preserving patient safety and academic standards.

## **8. Equality and Non-Discrimination**

- a. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability. Every PwBD candidate possessing a specified disability shall be entitled to equal treatment throughout the admission process.
- b. No authority shall discriminate against any PwBD candidate solely by reason of disability.
- c. Disability shall never be treated as a disqualification unless such disability demonstrably prevents the acquisition of essential competencies despite reasonable accommodation.
- d. Disability shall be understood in accordance with the rights recognized under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

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- e. Assessment shall recognize that disability arises from the interaction between an individual's impairment and environmental, institutional, social and attitudinal barriers.
- f. Efforts should be made to the extent to which reasonable accommodation, assistive technology and accessible educational practices, that can enable the candidate to successfully pursue medical education.

## **CHAPTER II**

### **ELIGIBILITY, DOCUMENTATION AND DISABILITY ASSESSMENT**

#### **9. Eligibility and Documentation**

**9.1** A candidate seeking admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) category shall possess a benchmark disability of not less than forty per cent (40%), in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the rules made thereunder.

**9.2** Every such candidate shall possess a valid Permanent Unique Disability Identity (UDID) Card issued through the UDID Portal by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India. The UDID Card shall serve as the primary documentary evidence of the existence, nature and extent of the specified disability for the purposes of these Guidelines.

**9.3** While the particulars recorded in the Permanent UDID Card, including the category, percentage and validity of the specified disability, shall ordinarily form the basis of consideration by the Medical Assessment Board, the Board shall independently determine the candidate's functional competency in accordance with these Guidelines. The determination of eligibility shall not be based solely upon the category or percentage of disability recorded in the UDID Card.

**9.4** Where the Medical Assessment Board considers it necessary for determining the functional competency of the candidate or the feasibility of providing reasonable accommodation, it may require the candidate to undergo such further clinical examination, functional evaluation or verification as it considers appropriate.

**9.5** Every candidate shall submit a self-certified affidavit declaring his or her functional abilities in the format specified in **Schedule-I**, which shall be verified by the Medical Assessment Board during the course of assessment.

**9.6** A candidate shall not be denied consideration under the PwBD category solely on account of a procedural defect or discrepancy in the Permanent UDID Card, provided that

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such defect is capable of rectification and the specified disability is otherwise established in accordance with law.

**9.7** Every admission to the MBBS Course under the PwBD category shall be regulated by these Guidelines, and every Medical College, Counselling Authority and Medical Assessment Board shall ensure strict compliance with the provisions contained herein.

## **10. Medical Assessment Board**

10.1 Every Medical Assessment Board shall discharge its functions fairly, objectively, transparently and in accordance with the principles of natural justice, equity and the rule of law.

10.2 Every candidate appearing before the Medical Assessment Board shall be treated with dignity, respect and fairness throughout the assessment process.

10.3 The Medical Assessment Board shall ensure that no candidate is subjected to physical, environmental, communication or attitudinal barriers during the assessment process.

10.4 The Medical Assessment Board shall undertake the assessment of candidates in accordance with—

(a) the assessment methodology prescribed under the Notification dated 12th March, 2024 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment;

(b) these Guidelines; and

(c) any other applicable statutory provisions governing the assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities.

## **11. Matters to be Verified and Evaluated**

**11.1** While assessing the eligibility of a candidate under these Guidelines, the Medical Assessment Board shall verify and evaluate, inter alia—

(a) the Permanent Unique Disability Identity (UDID) Card issued by the competent authority under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment;

(b) the nature, extent and stability of the specified disability and the underlying medical condition;

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- (c) the candidate's functional abilities in relation to the essential competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum;
- (d) the suitability and effectiveness of any assistive device, assistive technology or adaptive aid used by the candidate;
- (e) the feasibility of providing reasonable accommodation to facilitate acquisition of the prescribed competencies;
- (f) the impact, if any, of the disability upon patient safety; and
- (g) such other clinical, functional or educational factors as may be relevant for determining the candidate's eligibility under these Guidelines.

#### **11.2 Principles Governing Determination of Eligibility**

The determination of eligibility by the Medical Assessment Board shall be guided by the following principles—

##### **(a) Functional Competency**

The primary consideration shall be whether the candidate possesses, or can reasonably acquire with appropriate support and reasonable accommodation, the essential competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum.

##### **(b) Individualized Assessment**

Every assessment shall be individualized, objective and evidence-based. No candidate shall be declared eligible or ineligible solely on account of the category or percentage of disability.

##### **(c) Scientific Assessment**

Assessment shall be based upon objective medical findings, scientific evidence, functional evaluation, contemporary rehabilitation principles and evidence-based medical practice. The Medical Assessment Board shall avoid reliance upon outdated medical opinions, stereotypes or unsupported assumptions relating to disability. Where advances in rehabilitation medicine, assistive technology or adaptive devices substantially improve the functional abilities of the candidate, due consideration shall be given to such advancements while determining eligibility.

##### **(d) Reasonable Accommodation**

Prior to declaring a candidate ineligible, the Medical Assessment Board shall examine whether reasonable accommodation, assistive technology, adaptive devices or appropriate infrastructural support would enable the candidate to successfully pursue and complete the MBBS Course without compromising the acquisition of the prescribed competencies.

Provision of reasonable accommodation shall not be construed as dilution of academic standards but shall constitute a measure to ensure substantive equality of opportunity for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities.

Reasonable accommodation may include, inter alia—

- (i) assistive devices;
- (ii) adaptive equipment;
- (iii) digital accessibility;
- (iv) accessible teaching and learning material;
- (v) communication support;
- (vi) ergonomic modifications;
- (vii) examination accommodations consistent with academic standards; and
- (viii) accessible clinical learning environments.

**(e) Patient Safety**

Patient safety shall remain an important consideration while determining eligibility. However, any conclusion relating to patient safety shall be based upon objective clinical and functional evidence and shall not rest upon generalized assumptions, stereotypes or preconceived notions regarding disability.

**Chapter-III**

**Procedure for issuance of Certificate to the PwBD Candidate and Review Mechanism**

**12. Procedure for issuance of Certificate to the PwBD Candidate**

**12.1** Upon completion of the functional assessment, the Medical Assessment Board shall determine whether the candidate is Eligible; Eligible with Reasonable Accommodation, or Ineligible for admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) category in accordance with these Guidelines.

**12.2** The determination of eligibility shall be based on—

- (a) the candidate's demonstrated functional competency in relation to the essential competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum;
- (b) the feasibility of providing reasonable accommodation, assistive technology or other support measures, wherever appropriate;

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(c) the ability of the candidate to successfully complete the MBBS Course and acquire the prescribed competencies; and

(d) considerations relating to patient safety, supported by objective medical and functional evidence.

**12.3** No candidate shall be declared ineligible solely on the basis of—

(a) the diagnosis or category of disability;

(b) the percentage of benchmark disability recorded in the UDID Card or Disability Certificate; or

(c) generalized assumptions or stereotypes associated with any disability.

**12.4** A candidate shall be declared ineligible only where the Medical Assessment Board, after due consideration of reasonable accommodation and assistive technology, records, by a reasoned and speaking order, that the candidate is unable to acquire the essential competencies prescribed under the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum or that the disability would pose a demonstrable and unacceptable risk to patient safety which cannot be mitigated through reasonable accommodation.

**12.5** Every determination of the Medical Assessment Board shall be recorded in writing and shall clearly specify—

(a) the nature and extent of the disability;

(b) the findings of the functional competency assessment;

(c) the reasonable accommodation, if any, considered or recommended;

(d) the reasons supporting the determination of eligibility or ineligibility; and

(e) the final recommendation of the Board.

**12.6** The Medical Assessment Board shall issue an **Eligibility Certificate**, in the format specified in **Schedule-II**, certifying whether the candidate is—

(i) Eligible;

(ii) Eligible with Reasonable Accommodation, specifying the accommodation(s) recommended; or

(iii) Ineligible, together with the reasons recorded in accordance with clause 12.4.

### **13. Appellate Mechanism**

**13.1** Any candidate aggrieved by the findings or decision of the Medical Assessment Board may prefer an appeal before the **Appellate Authority** constituted by the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, within such time and in

such manner as may be notified by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) from time to time.

**13.2** The Appellate Authority shall independently examine the appeal and may, where considered necessary, call for the records of the Medical Assessment Board, direct a fresh medical assessment by an appropriate expert or specialist, seek additional medical opinion, or undertake such further examination as it deems fit in accordance with these Guidelines.

**13.3** The Appellate Authority shall pass a reasoned and speaking order, clearly recording the basis for affirming, modifying, or setting aside the findings of the Medical Assessment Board.

**13.4** The decision of the Appellate Authority shall be final for the purposes of counselling and admission under these Guidelines, subject to any order or direction of a court of competent jurisdiction.

## **CHAPTER IV**

### **MISCELLANEOUS**

#### **14. Institutional Responsibilities**

**14.1** Every Medical College, Medical Counselling Committee, State Counselling Authority and Medical Assessment Board shall ensure that the provisions of these Guidelines are implemented in letter and spirit.

**14.2** Every institution shall take appropriate measures to ensure that no PwBD candidate is denied admission or subjected to discrimination solely on the ground of disability, except in accordance with these Guidelines and the applicable statutory provisions.

**14.3** Every institution shall endeavor to provide reasonable accommodation, barrier-free access and accessible learning environments in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the applicable standards notified by the Government of India.

**14.4** Medical Colleges are encouraged to undertake periodic sensitization and capacity-building programmes for faculty members, administrative staff and students to promote an inclusive academic environment and eliminate physical, communication and attitudinal barriers.

**14.5** Every Medical College shall designate a Nodal Officer or establish an appropriate institutional mechanism in the nature of an enabling unit to serve as a single point of contact to address the PwBD candidates seeking clinical accommodations and further to facilitate implementation of these Guidelines and to address various other issues concerning PwBD candidates. These measures reflect the institutional responsibilities emphasized under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

#### **15. Grievance Redressal Mechanism**

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15.1 Every Medical College and Counselling Authority shall maintain an effective, accessible and time-bound grievance redressal mechanism for addressing complaints relating to disability assessment, denial of reasonable accommodation or any act of discrimination against PwBD candidates.

15.2 Every grievance shall be dealt with fairly, expeditiously and in accordance with the applicable provisions of law.

#### **16. Compliance**

16.1 Every admission to the MBBS Course under the Persons with Benchmark Disabilities category shall be governed by these Guidelines.

16.2 Every authority concerned with the admission process shall strictly comply with these Guidelines.

16.3 No Medical Assessment Board shall declare a candidate ineligible without recording reasons in writing based upon functional assessment, scientific evidence and the principles contained in these Guidelines.

16.4 Every recommendation of the Medical Assessment Board shall be made by a reasoned and speaking order.

#### **17. Power to Issue Clarifications**

The National Medical Commission may issue such clarifications, advisories, standard operating procedures or procedural instructions, consistent with these Guidelines and the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, as may be necessary for their effective and uniform implementation.

#### **18. Interpretation**

If any question arises regarding the interpretation or implementation of these Guidelines, the matter shall be referred to the National Medical Commission whose decision thereon shall be final, subject to the provisions of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and any judgment or direction of a competent Court.

#### **19. Repeal and Saving Clause**

19.1 These Guidelines shall supersede all previous guidelines, advisories and instructions issued by the National Medical Commission or the erstwhile Medical Council of India relating to the assessment of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities for admission to the MBBS Course, to the extent they are inconsistent with these Guidelines.

19.2 Notwithstanding such supersession, any action taken, assessment conducted or decision made under the earlier guidelines shall be deemed to have been validly taken or made insofar as it is not inconsistent with these Guidelines.

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## **20. Overriding Principle**

While implementing these Guidelines, every authority shall ensure that the assessment of a candidate is based upon functional competency, objective medical evidence and the possibility of reasonable accommodation. No candidate shall be denied consideration or declared ineligible solely on the basis of diagnosis, disability category or generalized assumptions regarding disability. The paramount considerations shall be equality of opportunity, maintenance of academic standards and patient safety, to be harmoniously applied in accordance with the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 and the Regulations and Guidelines framed thereunder and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

**ORDER**

In supersession of the previous orders dated 24-8-2011 and F.7(6)NRI/DME/Acad/2017/3486 dated 19-6-2018 issued earlier by the State regarding filling up seats of NRI quota till date, Following will be the guidelines applicable for the admission in Under Graduate/Post-Graduate, Medical/Dental Courses under NRI quota in all Private and Government Institutions of the State:-

1. A. At least one of the parents of students should be an NRI and shall ordinarily be residing abroad as an NRI; or  
 B. The person who sponsors the student for admission should be a first degree relative of the student (i.e. real Brother/real Sister) and should be ordinarily residing abroad as an NRI; or  
 C. If student is taken as a ward by some other nearest relative [as mentioned below (i) to (v)], such student may also be considered for admission provided the guardian has bonafidely treated the student as a ward. For this, following nearest relative (NRI) of candidate, who should be ordinarily residing abroad as an NRI can only be considered:-
  - i. Real brother and sister of father i.e. real uncle and real aunt.
  - ii. Real brother and sister of mother i.e. real maternal uncle and maternal aunt.
  - iii. Father and mother of father i.e. grandfather and grandmother.
  - iv. Father and mother of mother i.e. maternal grandfather and maternal grandmother.
  - v. First degree-paternal and maternal cousins.
2. **For PIO / OCI:-** Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs), Overseas Citizen of India (OCIs) are allowed for admission under NRI Quota in UG and PG (Medical /Dental) courses in the State of Rajasthan.
3. All NRI Candidate shall submit a proof of being sponsor as NRI/OCI/PIO in the form of certificate issued by the Indian embassy/Ministry of external affairs, Government of India for this purpose. In the absence of that certificate a duly notarized affidavit executed by the sponsor and notarized by the Notary Public of the foreign country where the sponsor resides being submitted by the sponsor, it be treated as sufficient as to the factum of the residence of the sponsor.
4. An affidavit from the sponsor that he/she looks after such student and will sponsor the entire fee of the candidate.

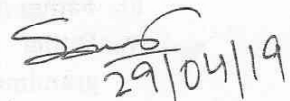

In pursuance to the recommendations of the committee constituted by the Government for the purpose of fixing fee for private Ayurvedic, Unani and Homoeopathy Colleges, the fee and number of seats for NRI students are fixed as under -

1. Seats under NRI quota shall be limited to 5% of the total intake as permitted by the respective council and rest of the seats shall be filled as per the State Government instructions issued from time to time.
2. The fee for NRIs seats in Ayurved College will be US\$ 15,000, (whole course) recoverable in 4 equal annual instalments. For Homoeopathy / Unani colleges, the fee would be US\$ 11,000, recoverable in 4 equal annual instalments.
3. The eligibility conditions for admission under NRI seats will also be the same as prescribed by the Dr. S.R. Rajasthan Ayurved University, Jodhpur for all other candidates.
4. NRI seats shall be filled based on the following criteria :-
  - I. First preference shall be given to those N.R.I candidates who are having ancestral Rajasthan Resident background.
  - II. Second preference shall be given to those N.R.I. candidates who are having ancestral background of other State and Union Territories of India.
  - III. Third preference shall be given to those Indian candidates who are sponsored by N.R.I. and sponsorship letter is attached with the application.
  - IV. Fourth preference will be given to those Indian candidates who is willing to pay a fee equivalent to US\$ 15,000 for B.A.M.S. & US\$ 11,000 for B.H.M.S/B.U.M.S.

Note :-

1. University/Institute/College would intimate the State Govt. and Dr. S.R. Rajasthan Ayurved University, Jodhpur about the candidates admitted under NRI quota and the fee charged from them.
